



Analysis of pupil premium spend up to March 2017

There are currently 66 pupils eligible for FSM and 8 CLA pupils. There are no children from armed forces families.

The amount received for 2016/2017 was £59,075 + £15,640 CLA funding giving a total of £74,715.

Analysis of the achievement data for pupils receiving pupil premium shows no significant difference across any Key Stage.

The achievement data shows that CLA pupils are more likely to achieve than non CLA pupils. There is one pupil who is below the expected grade in English but specific additional interventions have been put in place.

Attendance

Main reasons for absence have been illness and some unauthorised holidays. There was also a transport issue at the start of last half term where a number of children have had their transport removed pending a reapplication for eligibility.

SALT **19 pupils**

This shows intervention by both a specialist TA and a specialist Salt teacher. It involves working with the pupils on a one to one and in a class group

Careers **23 pupils**

Careers support and guidance is focussed on KS4 and KS5. Pupils have been seen individually and parents have also had the opportunity to make appointments. Advice and support has also been given at EHCP meetings.

Behaviour Support Worker **17 pupils**

The school BSW will support pupils on an individual basis through meetings, liaison with parents and in class and group situations.

Trips **76 pupils**

All of the pupils have benefitted from a range of trips which include sporting activities, museum visits, theatre visits as well as recreational activities

Phonics training**20 pupils**

All the primary staff have undergone specific phonics training for Read Write Inc. which has benefitted all primary pupils

Basic Needs funding**4 pupils**

Pupils have been supported with provision of uniform, sportswear etc when needed

Transport

Transport has been provided when needed for parents to attend meetings and return pupils home after trips and outings. It is also provided for pupils who are unable to travel independently to work experience placements.

Breakfast Club**6 pupils**

This operates every day for pupils to attend. There are also occasions when pupils are given breakfast if they arrive at school late having missed breakfast at home. The figure stated indicates pupils who have had free breakfasts although the amount charged does not reflect the full cost and is subsidised for all.

The figures used above are a reflection across the financial year and not the academic year and so there may be some slight movement

It is intended to continue this support for the forthcoming year.
