In practice we will implement: a curriculum where pupils explore, manipulate, experiment, and develop their skills to express their ideas and imagination creatively. opportunities for pupils to respond to and use a range of media and materials. the development of skills using simple tools and techniques competently and appropriately lessons to develop ability of pupils to select appropriate media and techniques (including drawing, painting, and sculpture with a range of materials, for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay), and adapt their work where necessary. opportunities for pupils to experience art through visiting artists and visits to galleries. 	The impact of the art curriculum will be evidenced by a triangulation of formal and termly assessments Half-termly book scrutinises, half termly lesson plar reviews, learning walks as needed and observations by subject leads in conjunction with senior staff. In addition other hard data will be used as necessary to obtain a clear, coherent understanding of the success of art.
