<p>Children use their senses to explore and learn about the world they live in beginning with their immediate surroundings and branching out to the wider school environment and the local area. As skills develop they learn to find their way, follow maps, explore the local area and plan and take part in simple journeys. Pupils learn about human and physical features of the world around them and investigate places of interest in the UK and around the world.</p>	<p>This will be implemented as follows</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• As part of the Understanding the World (UTW) area of the EYFS for class 1• A weekly geography lesson for pupils in KS 1-3• Through the DofE option at KS4• Through Vocational Studies (Independent Travel unit) at KS5• Delivery of trips / fieldwork• Through revisiting, consolidating and building on existing knowledge and skills• Using a wide range of resources / display materials adapted to meet the needs of all pupils including maps and digital maps• Through interesting, lively activities incorporating the use of drama, art and creativity where appropriate• Through cross curricular links with other subjects such as maths, science and PSHCE where appropriate.	<p>The impact of the geography curriculum will be evidenced by a triangulation of formal termly assessments. Half termly book scrutinies, half termly lesson plan reviews, learning walks as needed and observations by subject leads in conjunction with senior staff.</p> <p>In addition other hard data will be used as necessary to obtain a clear, coherent understanding of the success of geography.</p>
