Children learn about their timeline, their world at present and how it looked in the past. They explore history through a range of sources such as objects, artefacts, pictures, photographs, meeting people, written texts and technology. They make comparisons, develop research skills and make connections between the past and the present. Half termly book scrutinies, half termly lesson plan reviews, learning walks as needed and observations by subject leads in conjunction with senior staff.  In addition other hard data will be used as necessary to obtain a clear, coherent understanding of the success of history.
